WHAT IS HHC OPTIONS

HHC Options is a program to help people pay their medical bills and apply for public health insurance. HHC stands for the Health and Hospitals Corporation. This is the <u>public</u> hospitals and clinics in New York City that give medical care to people even if they can't pay the full bill for their care. (Please see the list of HHC facilities beginning on page 14.) If you get medical care at the city public hospitals and clinics, <u>HHC can reduce your medical bills</u>, if you qualify. But medical care is very costly, so HHC asks you to help by giving information to see if you, or a family member, can get on a public health insurance program.

What Does This Mean for YOU?

When you go to an HHC hospital or clinic, you can get your bills lowered if you <u>qualify for HHC Options</u>. HHC helps patients apply for public health insurance. If you are not eligible for the insurance, HHC has a sliding fee scale based on your income and the size of your family. That means your bill for the health care you get is based on how much money you earn. Every HHC patient with incomes below a certain poverty level set by the federal government is eligible for the sliding fee scale (for example, up to \$64,360 for a family of three). (See the charts beginning on page 8.) Everyone is eligible <u>regardless of their immigration status</u>.

Even if you have insurance, like Medicare, it may not cover all of the health services you need. You may be able to get a sliding fee scale for the services you need that your insurance will not pay for (such as dental care). To get the sliding fee scale, you will need to meet with a Financial Counselor at an HHC hospital or clinic. (To speak to an HHC Financial Counselor call any one of the telephone numbers on page 5.) You will need to <u>cooperate</u> by giving the Financial Counselor information. You should try to have the meeting with the Financial Counselor the first time that you go to an HHC hospital or clinic, unless you have an emergency. The sooner you apply for insurance or the fee scale, the sooner you can reduce the amount of your bill.

Be aware: if you do not meet with the financial counselor and work out your eligibility for insurance or how much you will have to pay, you will be charged the full amount of your bill, which may be a lot of money. If you do not pay, your bill may be sent to a collection agency. HHC has a contract with collection agencies to help them collect inpatient bills, but this could hurt your credit rating. Even though the collection agency must follow the same rules as HHC staff, it is much better to meet with the Financial Counselor and cooperate as much as you can.

There are two reasons that you are asked to cooperate with the Financial Counselor:

- To figure out if you are eligible for any of the free or below cost public health insurance programs, like Medicaid and Child Health Plus. If you are eligible, the Counselors will help you apply for these programs. Having health insurance takes away some of the worries of getting needed medical care.
- 2. If you are not eligible for any insurance programs, the Counselor may reduce your fees, if eligible, through HHC Options for each visit or other service you need.

About Health Insurance & HHC Options

HHC staff first needs information to figure out if you are eligible for any of the public health insurance programs. These programs include:

Medicaid

Child Health Plus - for youngsters up to age 19

Family Health Plus - for adults 19 through age 64

EPIC – for seniors over age 65 to help pay for medicines.

PCAP – for pregnant women and their infants.

ADAP – for people with HIV/AIDS.

Having health insurance means you don't have to worry about paying for most medical care. Almost all medical services that you need will be paid for, so there is less need to worry about money from your pocket. Speak with an HHC Financial Counselor to see if you are eligible for coverage.

Programs for Immigrants

There are some programs which immigrants are eligible for, even people who are here without documents, so everyone is asked questions. Undocumented children are eligible for Child Health Plus and pregnant women are eligible for PCAP. In an emergency, undocumented patients are eligible for a special Medicaid program. Many HHC patients are immigrants. HHC staff is trained to know who is eligible.

Many immigrants, documented and undocumented, are concerned about using government services and sharing personal information. <u>HHC staff is trained to respect and protect the privacy of all patients.</u> This means that no patient at an HHC facility will be reported to Immigration. It also means that no information shared by a patient in confidence will be passed along by the hospital or clinic.

HHC facilities also have many staff members who speak the languages spoken in the community. If you need one, you can ask for an interpreter. There is no extra cost to you for getting care in your language. Many of the forms and information have been translated into languages other than English. You have a right to request that all information be explained to you in your language.



To apply for public health insurance, or to be placed on the fee scale, you will need to meet with a Financial Counselor at an HHC hospital or clinic – see the list of telephone numbers to call on page 5. Some people have a hard time producing or finding documents to prove identity or income. You will need to try to bring at least the following types of information:

- identity and date of birth: (for example: a birth certificate, Baptismal record, Consular I.D., or foreign passport);
- home address: (for example: I.D. or a letter or bill sent to you);
- **proof of income:** (for example: copy of check or stubs, pay envelope, letter or written statement from the employer, person, or agency providing income. If you cannot get a written statement, talk to the Financial Counselor about your income.)

WHAT WILL YOU HAVE TO PAY

The fee you will have to pay for medical care is on a sliding fee scale based on your income and family size. As an example, the fee for an adult in the clinics and the emergency room goes from \$15 to \$60 based on your income. This fee covers almost all outpatient services, including blood tests and most X-rays. You will have to pay a fee for medications if you have no insurance. The fee is \$10 for each prescription, up to a total of \$40 for each visit. So if you have five prescriptions, it would be \$40 for the medication on that visit. But if you cannot pay this fee and need your medicine, tell the pharmacy that you can't pay and they will send you to see a Financial Counselor. The financial counselor can say that you will not have to pay for medicine that day.

Please note that for children, the fee scale for outpatient care starts at a higher income, so the parents of many children do not have to pay for outpatient care for their children.

Even if you need to stay overnight in a hospital bed, there is a sliding fee scale to reduce the cost for patients with incomes up to 400% of federal poverty level. The fee scale for inpatient care is higher and goes from \$150 up to \$5,000 based on your income. The hospital will also look at other money or things of value your family has. You may also be charged a percent of your assets. Ask the HHC staff to work with you on a time payment plan that you can afford.

THE FEE SCALES FOR DIFFERENT TYPES OF SERVICES BEGIN ON PAGE 8.

Some of the charts may be difficult to understand. The next page will explain how you can read and use these charts. Remember that you <u>must cooperate</u> with the Financial Counselor at the HHC hospital or clinic that you go to for health care services, before you can be eligible for the HHC Options/Sliding Fee Scale. This means applying for public health insurance if you might be eligible.

To understand these charts, look at the left hand side first, where it says family size. A family is a parent or parents, guardian, and their children. When you find the number of people in your family, look across to the right and find the yearly, monthly, or weekly income for your family. Then look up on top of the chart in the same column and find what you will have to pay each time you make a medical visit.

Chart 1 – Emergency and Clinic Visits for Children: The lowest clinic and emergency room fee for children starts at a high income. This is because many children, regardless of their immigration status, are eligible for Child Health Plus. So for example, with a family size of two – a parent and one child – there would be no charge if the family income is up to \$616 a week.

Chart 2 – Emergency and Clinic Visits for Adults: The clinic and emergency room fee for adults starts at \$15 for a visit. So for example, if there are three people in your family and the family income is \$452 a week, the clinic and emergency room fee would be \$15 for each visit.

Chart 3 – Ambulatory Surgery and MRI Testing for Adults and Children: Ambulatory surgery is one-day outpatient surgery, when you do not stay in the hospital overnight. MRI (Magnetic Resonance Imaging) is a special X-ray done to test for certain problems, which is costly. The fee for these services starts at \$150 and goes up to \$850 or more. Ask to speak to a Financial Counselor to work out how you can pay for these services.

Chart 4 – Medicare Patients' Fee for Emergency and Clinic Visits: This is the fee you pay for co-payment or if you get a service that Medicare does not pay for.

Chart 5 – Inpatient Services: Inpatient care is when you have to stay in a hospital bed for one or more nights. You may be eligible for Medicaid while in the hospital. But if you are not, the fee for this service is complicated because it is based on your income and goes from \$150 to \$5,000 or more for the inpatient stay. But also, because this is the most costly care, the amount that you pay is also based on the assets (or resources) that your family has. So for example, if you have a bank account, or stocks or bonds, some of this resource will not be counted. If your resources are over a certain amount, you will also have to pay a percent of the amount over what is not counted. The more you have, the more you will pay.
